- Be involved in or have conducted research relating to the following topics: Actuarial Sciences, Adaptation, Climate Change, Earth Science, Economics, Emergency Management, Engineering, Geography, Hydrology, Meteorology, Resiliency, Risk Management, Socioeconomics, Seismology, or other fields related to catastrophes

Your submission should include (in word or pdf format):

- 1. A brief statement of what you hope to get out of attending the conference (written or recorded feel free to be creative)
- 2. An abstract of the research you wish to present and discuss (Max 300 words)
 - a. This should include why you chose this research, the process, results, and impacts
- 3. A resume or CV with your contact information and relevant education (Max 1 page)
